### What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal aid program for elementary and secondary schools. The program supports supplemental services designed to improve the educational performance of low achieving children in higher-poverty schools.

The amount of money a Title I school receives is based on the number of students receiving free or reduced lunch.

## How are students selected?

Students are selected using the following:

- ◆ Star Early/Star computer test
- ◆ DIBELS Assessment
- ◆ CBM Assessment
- ◆ OCCT scores
- ◆ Teacher recommendation



## Small Group Instruction

Title 1 Classes offer small group instruction to students who qualify.

### How often are students pulled from the regular classroom?

Title I students are served four days a week in the subject for which they qualified for services. The reading specialist and the classroom teacher will ensure it is not during reading or math time. In some situations the Title I reading instruction could be inside of the regular classroom.

### Release from Title I Services

We conduct ongoing assessments of the students and sometimes the child will demonstrate great gains and can then be released from Title 1.
